HOW TO GET TO Silver Creek Metro Park.

Silver Creek Metro Park is located off Hametown Rd., west of State Rt. 21 and north of State Rt. 585, in Norton.

EXPLORE

From I-76 / US Rt. 224: Travel west to State Rt. 21 and go south. Take State Rt. 21 south approx. 3 mi. to State Rt. 585. Take State Rt. 585 south and immediately exit at Hametown Rd. Turn left (north) on Hametown Rd. and travel 1/2 mi. to the park entrance on the left.

Picnic Shelter

Pheasant Run Shelter is an open-air picnic shelter that may be reserved by calling 330-867-5511.

Swimming

A swimming lake is open to the public during the summer months. The swimming season opens Memorial Day weekend. During swim season, an admission fee is charged for entry into the park. Season swim passes are available. Children under 2 years of age are admitted free.

Boating

Pedal boats, canoes and rowboats may be rented at the boathouse.

Fishing

Fishing is permitted from the dock located on the southwest shore of the lake near the boathouse and from designated shorelines. An Ohio fishing license is required.

Bridle Trail

Equestrians with their own horse can ride along the only bridle trail in the Metro Parks. Part of the route is through private property and riders are asked to be especially courteous.

Winter Sports

Chippewa and Pheasant Run trails offer cross-country skiers the best trails for this sport in the Metro Parks. Unlighted ice skating at Big Oaks Area.
